SET YOUR TIVO: "Danger Coast," a 10-episode TV series following Miami-Dade fireboat rescuers, is to premier at 9:30 p.m. Friday on CMT. County commissioners saw an action-packed preview Tuesday, as rescuers dealt with everything from a yacht fire to a heart attack at sea. The show illustrates the "unique nature" of calls to the department, Commissioner **Sally Heyman** said. And "millions and millions of viewers" could catch it, producer **Chris Sloan** of 2C Media said — the CMT network is available in 70 million homes.

VENOM VISION: Miami-Dade Fire Rescue's Venom Response Bureau may just be the next of the county's TV stars, following in the footsteps of its fireboat rescuers and animal cops. Commissioners agreed Tuesday without discussion to work up a deal with locally based 2C Media to produce a pitch reel for a show based on the venom bureau's work. Animal Planet has expressed interest in the would-be series, documents say. 2C Media is also behind the soon-to-debut "Danger Coast" series.
