

# Two move into A&E's small town of 'Sugarloaf'

LOS ANGELES — Kiele Sanchez and Carlos Gomez have landed co-starring roles in A&E's drama pilot "Sugarloaf."

The project, from Fox TV Studios, centers on Jim Longworth (Matt Passmore), a Chicago cop kicked off the force after being shot by his former captain, who wrongfully accused Jim of having an affair with his wife. After receiving a payout, Jim, an observant detective with a sly sense of humor, moves to a small Florida

town and joins the state police.

Sanchez will play Jim's romantic interest, Callie, a nurse who moonlights at a pizza place to pay for medical school.

Uriah Shelton has been cast as Callie's 12-year-old son, whom she is raising alone while her husband is in prison.

Gomez will play Jim's golf partner, friend and colleague, a forensic medical examiner.
